About The Friends of St Mary's, Bacton...

In the three or so years we've been going, we've staged about half a dozen variety shows or concerts of one sort or another. We've done a fashion show and even a teddy bear abseil. We've had some very generous gifts of money. We've organised three metal detecting days and produced and sold Christmas cards and notelets. In total we've raised more than £20,000.

Why do we do it? Because all of us, in our own ways, value St Mary's: as a place of worship in some cases; because we were married there, perhaps, or have family buried there. Or for its beauty and the craftsmanship which went into it, or for what it records of the history of Bacton. We also recognised that if we - the people living in Bacton today - wouldn't pay to keep the church in good repair, noone else would.

Where has the money gone? So far, we have helped the Parochial Church Council pay for

repairs to several of the windows, especially the clerestory windows, and bought a new boiler. We've also paid for and made the pew cushions.

Unfortunately there is going to be more expense (there always is with old buildings), and I think we have to aim to raise about £5,000 a year, every year.

Which brings me to the other strand of what we do. We want to put St Mary's back at the heart of village life and we want in particular to persuade Bacton's young people that it's *their* church, to use and enjoy (and maintain in their

turn). That's why we try to involve the young in our activities and why we sponsor a talk in St Mary's for an entire middle school year group, each year.
