Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

The Friends have organised a number of events over the course of the year, which have raised funds, provided educational opportunities and brought local people together in the church building.

A day of Metal Detecting, held on fields in the village, for a local metal detecting club raised £812, and the participants found a number of interesting objects.

An evening lecture on the history and architecture of the church, held in the church, was attended by some 70 people.

A talent show, featuring local people with a wide variety of talent filled the church, and made over £1000 towards building maintenance.

A Christmas concert of mediaeval music once again filled the church and brought in welcome funds.

We paid for a local historian to deliver "hands on" history lessons in the church so that children from our local schools might be better informed about their church building.

We continued to build our group of financial supporters who make regular payments to our funds, including having a presence at the summer Bacton Fayre.

We were able, through this activity, to raise sufficient funds to make donations to the Parochial Church council of some £2883 towards essential maintenance, and to build up an excess of income of £8132. This healthy balance will be, we expect, handed over to the Parochial Church Council early in the next financial year to help them to meet the considerable expense of further planned maintenance of the building.

We have paid for, and our members have made sufficient cushions to alleviate the discomfort of nearly all the church pews – much appreciated by all those who use the church for whatever reason – worship or leisure.
