# Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

The Friends have once again organised a number of events over the course of the year, which have raised funds, provided educational opportunities and brought local people together in the church building.

This year's activities including the hosting of the Hermitage Ensemble who performed in St Mary's on 7 April, albeit the event was jointly staged with other Friends Groups within our benefice.

We staged two metal detecting rallies, in July and March. Both were most successful financially and in providing the detectors with an enjoyable day out.

We had a stand at the annual Bacton Fayre, selling recipes and telling people about the work of the Friends, and we staged a Christmas Carol concert with the Stowmarket Jubilee Choir providing the music.

We made a significant grant to the PCC to pay for essential pointing work to the North Wall of St Mary's, and representatives of the Friends attended relevant meetings of the PCC to help develop plans for the improvement of the interior of St Mary's
